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Part 1: General Information

History and Background

Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences has been developed along with Rajabhat Suan Sunandha University. Initially, it was not divided into a faculty. Instructors attached to the faculty are responsible to instruct each course which is an important part of educational curriculum. In 1975, the Act to escalate teacher collages into higher education institutes was promulgated; therefore, "Department of Humanities and Social Sciences" was established in 1992. "Department of Humanities and Social Sciences" was changed to "Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences" in accordance with the Rajabhat Institute Act and a position "head of department" was changed into "dean" for throughout the time. The faculty is responsible in planning instruction of GE (general education) course for undergraduate students in several faculties, as well as major course/ specific course for students of faculties as follows:

At the present time, the faculty opens for instructions for Bachelor's degree, total 13 programs. In 2016, the faculty has 7,083 students, categorized into 7,083 undergraduate students divided into 6,867 regular students and 216 irregular students and has personnel, total 154 persons divided into 110 academic personnel and 44 academic-supported personnel.

The faculty has premise for supporting instructions for students and personnel operation, total 3 buildings such as 35th, 36th and 37th buildings consisted 1) 41 classrooms 2) 5 computer laboratories 3) 6 special operation rooms: operation rooms for Lodging and Hotel and Information branch, court mock-up room of Law branch and cultural operation room and etc.

In addition, the faculty adopts information technology for using in university operations to drive the university forwards, for example ERP (enterprise resource planning), E-Office, E-Learning and etc.








Figure 1: New Enrollments categorized by Types of Enrollments in the Faculty since 2014-2016 Academic Years Source: Education Service: Section




Figure 2 Remained Students since 2014-2016 Academic Years Source Education Service Section






Figure 3: Foreign Students Since2014-2016 Academic Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 5: Employment Rate Since2013-2015 Academic Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 7: New Programs Since2014-2016Academic Years Source: Education Service: Section




Figure & Improved Programs Since2014-2016 Academic Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 9: Satisfaction towards Information Technology Since2013-2015 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section








Figure 11: Research Funding Since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service: Section




Figure 13: Percentage of Researches Application since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 14: Percentage of Published Researches in National or International Levels since 2014/2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section

In fiscal year of 2015, the faculty arranged a knowledge base activity in academic service learning resource: learning center library providing services on ASEAN knowledge.






Figure 16: Academic Projects applying for Instruction Improvement Percentage since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 17: Service Receivers applying Knowledge in Practical Use Percentage since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 18: Comparison of Activities of Preservation of Art and Culture since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 19: Satisfaction Levels of the Participants joining in Activities of Preservation of Art and Culture since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section





Figure 20: Total Instructors according to Academic Position since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section




Figure 22: Total Personnel Development Activities since 2014-2016 Fiscal Years Source: Education Service Section

• Cooperation between Domestic and International Institutes

Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences has had a cooperation between several agencies within and outside the country in 2014-2016 fiscal years as follow:

Academic cooperation project between Rajabhat Suan Sunandha University and Yunnan Normal University in Joint Venture Bachelor's Degree Program has proceeded since 2005. Yunan Normal University has sent students to Rajabhat Suan Sunandha University for 2 years. Furthermore, in the academic year of 2016, Yunnan Normal University sends 17 students to study in education management project for the students from Yunan Normal University at Rajabhat Suan Sunandha University. The students enroll in Tourism Industry and Hospitality Branch, Department of Social Sciences, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences.





In MOU signing ceremony between SSRU and UEA on 13th July, 2016, Assoc. Prof. Reudej Koetwichai, rector of Rajabhat Suan Sunandha University and Dr.Koji Kushida, rector of East Asia University, Japan signed academic MOU between SSRU and UEA at the conference room of the rector office, 5th floor. Regarding this academic mutual cooperation, instructor Premwadee Na Nakhon Phanom, head of Japanese language branch, Department of Humanities, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences coordinated with Dr.Hiramatsu Ryuen. Furthermore, in March of 2016, rector Dr. Koji Kushida traveled to visit the university and faculty in order to negotiate and have a preliminary discussion until the completion of this MOU signing ceremony.

As for an exchange program, it will start in 2017. Initially, 3 students of Japanese branch will travel to Japan for exchanging language and culture in July and students from UEA will travel to Thailand for exchanging language and culture at SSRU in incoming September. Moreover, UEA is glad to allow SSRU link to place on the university website. The Japanese branch would like to thank all foreign relations personnel to facilitate in everything and administrators of the faculty, instructors in Japanese branch and every person to provide support in the signing ceremony to be completed without adversary.



Educational Quality Assurance


